## LEGAL

## Participation in sweepstakes exclusively through the purchase of services or goods

Anyone who combines participation in a sweepstake with the purchase of services or goods at prices that are at most in line with the market for the purpose of short-term sales promotion does not require a permit, provided there is no risk of excessive gambling.

Example: In the retail trade, every purchaser of chocolate is automatically entered into a draw for a voucher for an annual subscription to a fitness center. The chocolate costs the same as in the previous year, when the purchase was not associated with participation in a raffle.

Pakapoo.online is a charitable voluntary organization, registered under the laws of the Cayman Islands, with the aim of a non-profit short term promotion of the NFT Gallery accessible via https://ghostmarket.io/account/user/sawi6p/. The pakapoo.online client purchases a digital image. The invoice number automatically enters into draw to have the option to win a digital asset. The digital image purchased would cost the same as if the client would not participate in the sweepstake.

Further, Cayman Islands do not qualify digital assets as legal tender.

In order to further widening its sustainable impact Pakapoo.online donates 2% of its income for charitable community projects world wide and reduces the world wide carbon food print on Bitcoin Mining Farms together with Almightytree.ch.

Cayman Islands Gambling Law 2016 Revision, according to Section 2(A) 1 states the law shall not apply to Section 2(A) b, "raffles staged by churches, service organizations and other voluntary associations to raise funds for the programmes of the respective churches, organizations and associations." and Section 158(h) of the Penal Code (2013 Revision) shall not apply to persons who stage raffles in accordance with this Law.
